Sabine FFA Agriculture Advocacy Team Qualifies For State Meet

The Sabine FFA Agriculture Advocacy Team took First Place in the District Contest held on November 8 at Waskom High School. The team then advanced to the Area Competition held November 17 in Marshall. At the Area Contest they competed against the top twelve teams in the Area and secured Second Place behind Chapel Hill High School. They advanced to the State Competition on December 2-3 at Sam Houston State University.

Agriculture Advocacy Contest Teams have to present a program to a panel of judges describing the importance of agriculture and its application in our everyday lives. Teams present a program that covers the following - Biotechnology, Genetically Modified Organisms, Soil Conservation, Animal Husbandry, and Vertical Farming Techniques. After the program, the students field questions from a panel of judges based off of their research.

The Leadership Development Events (LDE) helps students explore new ideas and participants must be able to think on their feet and present factual information in a timely manner. Most importantly, LDE events teaches students how to communicate on a professional level, which in turn, helps them to develop the leadership skills they need; guiding them in life no matter what career path they may choose.

This year was the first time one of Sabine's LDE teams qualified for the State Competition, which consisted of the top 20 teams in Texas, who earned a State spot by competing against a total of 298 high schools across the State. Sabine's Leadership Development Events Team is proudly referred to as a State Semi-Finalist!

These students have worked extremely hard and we are so proud of them! Thank you to our School District, our administration and our community for supporting these students. We were honored to represent Sabine at the State Competition and was overwhelmed by the "send off" by the community, staff and students.
